Message from our Principal:

In these first few months, I've been continually humbled and impressed by the spirit of collaboration and support that defines St Peter's. From our students who demonstrate kindness, curiosity and a thirst for learning to our talented educators who go above and beyond to nurture our students' growth and wellbeing. Furthermore, the commitment of our families who play an integral role in their children's education, it is clear that we share a common goal: to provide the best possible learning environment for every child. Leadership Day:

Last week, our Leadership Team engaged in a professional development day together offsite. The day was inspiring, productive and a great success.

Our topics of exploration included:

- Prayer and reflection: servant leadership as modelled by Jesus
- Personal leadership development: who am I as a leader?
- Team building: what makes an effective leadership team? (measuring our impact using Dr Simon Breakspears 'Empowered Teams: 5 Dimensions Tool')
- School Review: Who do we serve and how are we going? (collecting evidence for the 'Community Sphere Rubric')
- Reflection and feedback: Looking back, moving forward... (What's Working Well (WWW) and Even Better If (EBI) to set goals for term 2 as a Leadership Team.

Creating time and space to ensure we are reflecting on our leadership and the impact we are having is essential for us as a team to serve and support our community to the best of our ability. One of our goals as a leadership team is to be reflective of and purposeful in 'pace setting' for our school community. Everyday we are making decisions, responding to needs and thinking strategically about the school's vision, improvement plan and most importantly the children in our care. To ensure that we are considering all stakeholders, the impact of our decisions, following policies and protocols as well as taking the time required to attend to the human emotions, wellbeing and welfare needs of all in our community we must ensure that we are setting realistic expectations around the time spent on responding to and planning for all that we do. Amy's official last day will be on Thursday 28th March. We will celebrate her contributions and impact at St Peter's at the Easter Bonnet Parade. Myself, Kristina Cozzi and Belinda Harper are continuing to conduct interviews to fill the LSO position for 2KT. We will keep you updated as this progresses.
- We would like to formally thank Shannon Wrigglesworth for her time, contributions and positive impact she has had as an LSO in our learning community. Shannon has formally finished up as an LSO here at St Peter's. We are still blessed to have her with us as she completes her final placement as a student teacher working in Katrina's classroom. Georgia Padula will be joining the St Peter's staff to work in 3AC beginning in term 2. Georgia is currently studying at ACU for a Bachelor of Education and comes to us with a range of experience working with children.

<u>School Drop Off & Pick Up - Child Safety Protocols and Road Safety Regulations:</u>

It has been noted that some children are arriving at school before 8:30am and crossing the street to play on the Overland Reserve Playground on Parkside Avenue. Children are also riding their bikes to school and riding over the humps on the oval across the street. Please understand that the school cannot take responsibility for any unfortunate incidents/injuries that may occur in these areas as these children are not supervised. Supervision of children occurs on school premises from 8:30am (when the gates open).

We continue to observe children playing on the Junior Yard Adventure Playground after school. Although parents may be watching, please note that the adventure playground is out of bounds before and after school. These measures are in place for child safety and legal reasons. We thank you for your co-operation and support in adhering to these guidelines.

We have loved the strong participation in the school's initiative to encourage 'Movement in March' including promoting riding a bike or scooting to school. We are pleased to see students practising safety measures such as wearing a helmet. Students are to be reminded about safety rules such as, moving safely into school by getting off the bike or scooter and walking (not riding) safely through the grounds to the bike rack opposite the library entrance.

As we navigate the bustling traffic around our school grounds during drop-off and pick-up times, I wish to emphasise the importance of road safety and respectful behaviour. Our community's safety is a shared responsibility, and by demonstrating patience and respect, we can create a safer environment for everyone.

First and foremost, please prioritise the safety of all individuals on the road, especially our children. A few reminders to ensure a smooth and safe drop-off and pick-up experience:

- **Follow Traffic Rules:** Obey traffic laws, including speed limits, parking regulations, and designated drop-off zones. These rules are in place to protect everyone.
- **Be Patient:** Traffic congestion during drop-off and pick-up times can be frustrating, but patience is key. Avoid honking excessively or making abrupt manoeuvres that could endanger pedestrians or other vehicles.
- Respect Crosswalks and Pedestrians: Always yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and at intersections. Allow them ample time to cross safely, even if it means waiting a few extra moments.
- Stay Alert: Keep your attention focused on the road and your surroundings. Avoid distractions such as texting or phone calls while driving through school zones.
- Model Respectful Behaviour: Your actions speak volumes to your children and the children in our community. By modelling patience and respect for other drivers, pedestrians, and school staff, we instil these values in the next generation.
- **Use Designated Drop-off Zones:** Utilise designated drop-off and pick-up areas to keep traffic flowing smoothly. Avoid stopping in no-parking zones or blocking entrances/exits.
- **Plan Ahead:** Leave home with plenty of time to spare, especially during peak traffic hours. Planning ahead can help reduce stress and ensure a safer commute for everyone.

• Report Unsafe or Disrespectful Behaviour: If you witness any unsafe or disrespectful behaviour on the roads, gather as much information as possible. Note down the date, time, location, and a detailed description of the incident including registration numbers. Reach out to the appropriate local authorities responsible for traffic enforcement and road safety. This may include local law enforcement agencies, traffic management departments, or our school office. Provide them/us with a detailed account of the incident and any evidence you have gathered. By taking proactive steps to report unsafe or disrespectful behaviour on the roads around the school, you contribute to creating a safer environment for students, parents, and the wider community. Your vigilance and commitment to road safety are invaluable in preventing accidents and promoting responsible behaviour on the roads.

Our goal is to create a welcoming and safe environment for all members of our school community. By working together and demonstrating mutual respect on the road, we can achieve this goal effectively.

This week St Peter's has been alive and buzzing as the children have engaged in a range of fun activities to celebrate their learning and achievements as well as this spiritual and sacred time in our liturgical year. Our students have absolutely loved participating in our Harmony Day celebrations, Modern Australia Dance Incursion, Book Swap, and Silent Disco today. The smiles on their faces say it all!

We are so looking forward to our Community Easter Bonnet Parade tomorrow morning at 9:00am. We have loved hearing the children share about their creative, innovative and sustainable designs. It will be an absolute joy to gather together as a united community to sing, dance and praise our Lord Jesus Christ! I look forward to seeing you then along with our special surprise visitor!!!


