School Review - Dialogue and Engagement Day:

Our Executive Team met with Leslie Tulloch to engage in dialogue about our 'Draft' School Review Report for 2024. We were very proud of the achievements and progress St Peter's has made over the past five years. Leslie will now finalise the report and share this with us in the coming weeks. We will then share this with staff and our School Advisory Board to read, analyse and celebrate St Peter's as a high performing school. Our next steps are to look ahead to our future recommendations and opportunities for maintaining and nurturing our great practices as well as introducing new initiatives to improve other areas in our school. Our Executive Team will engage in two 'School Improvement Planning' workshop days offsite at the Moonee Ponds office with Rosa Wilkinson and other MACS representatives in week 7 of this term (20th and 21st Nov). With this team and the findings from the report, we will co-construct our school improvement priorities to work towards in 2025 to 2028. We will share this '2025 - 2028 St Peter's School Improvement Plan' with our school community at the beginning of 2025.

We wish to thank all of our staff, students and families for engaging in our school review process to provide your insights, voice and feedback. We look forward to the journey ahead as we work together to bring the best possible education and learning environment to the children in our care.

Exciting Announcements and Celebrations:

New Specialist Classes at St Peter's

We are excited to announce some changes to our specialist classes at St Peter's beginning in 2025. As part of our ongoing efforts to provide the best educational experience for our students, we will be introducing two new specialist subjects for all year levels, from Prep to Year 6: STEM for Sustainability and Visual Arts.





STEM for Sustainability will focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, encouraging students to think creatively and critically about sustainable practices while also incorporating faith links as we learn to be stewards of God's creation.

Visual Arts will provide a creative environment for students to explore and express themselves through various art forms, offering an opportunity to develop their artistic skills.


As we make these changes, 'Resilience Project Social and Emotional Learning' will no longer be a specialist subject for Years 3 to 6, and 'Library Learning' will be removed as a specialist subject for Prep to Year 2. We believe these new subjects will enrich our students' learning experiences and better prepare them for the future. We are advertising for these new specialist teachers internally. We look forward to announcing who is successfully appointed in these positions and providing more information to our learning community about what these subjects will offer our students.

- 5.STEM for Sustainability (*new)


New Wellbeing program and data collection at St Peter's

New Wellbeing Inititaves at St Peter's

We are excited to share with you some important improvements to our social-emotional learning (SEL) strategies at St Peter's. Over the past two years, we have successfully implemented The Resilience Project, which has helped strengthen our students' ability to show gratitude, empathy, and mindfulness. This program has begun to create a consistent language and a whole-school approach centred on building positive emotions and emotional literacy. To continue building on this strong foundation, we have critically reviewed our SEL programs and identified opportunities for growth. We understand the need to equip our entire community—students, staff, and parents—to best support the social and emotional needs of our students, particularly in today's ever-changing world.

As a result, we are excited to introduce enhancements to our SEL approach implementing the **Berry Street Education Model** and the integration of the **Pulse** platform to support students' self-regulation, relationships and wellbeing to increase student engagement and significantly improve academic achievement. It will focus on:

- Building staff competencies to ensure they feel confident and equipped to support students.
- Consistency across our whole school community so that every child receives the same level of support and care.
- Providing evidence-based lessons tailored to each year level for proven impact.

Incorporating the Berry Street Education Model will build on the positive culture we've already established by emphasising safety, growth, and hope for all students. This model will further enhance our efforts to create an environment where every student feels safe, valued and supported.

To better support our students' wellbeing, we will implement Pulse; a data collection tool designed for quick, easy, and fun weekly check-ins.

This platform allows students to reflect on their social, emotional, and physical wellbeing by answering evidence-based questions in just 60 seconds each week. Key features include:

- Safe and accessible check-ins that foster a positive and supportive school culture.
- Rapid intervention capabilities to connect vulnerable students with trusted adults when they need help.
- An engaging and student-friendly approach that ensures all students, even those who may not speak up, have a voice.

We believe these improvements will help us continue to provide a supportive and nurturing environment for our students. We look forward to collaborating with you as we implement these new strategies, and we appreciate your ongoing support.




