It is wonderful to see St Peter's students taking the initiative and showing pride in our environment. Their enthusiasm helps keep our school clean while inspiring others to do the same.

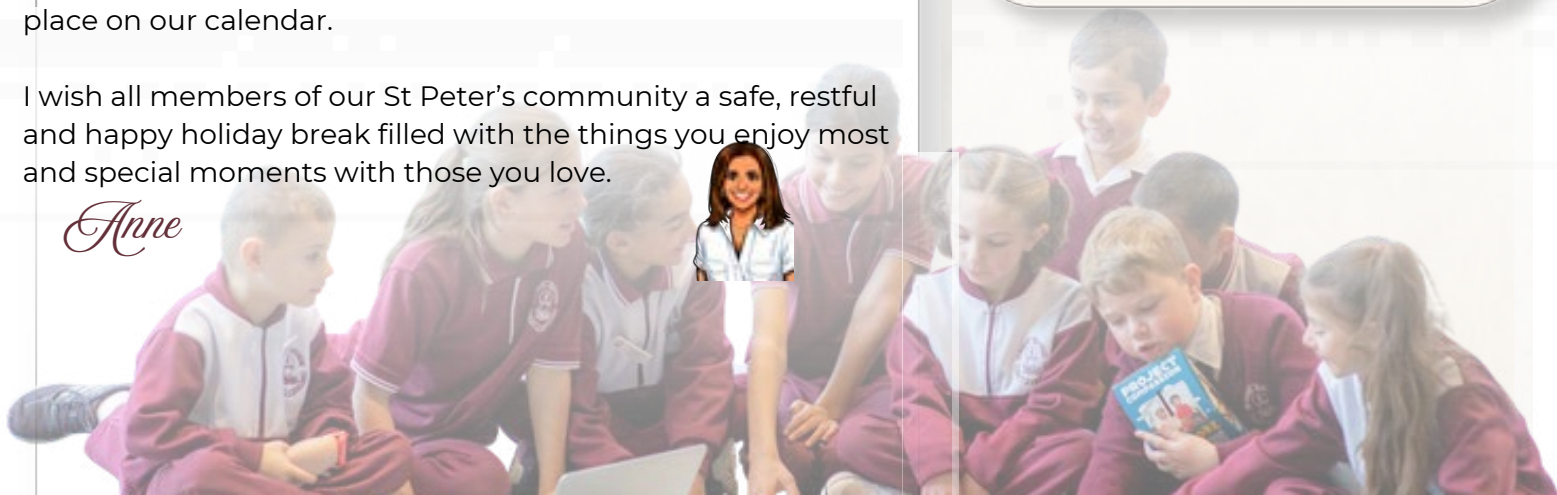

Missionary Sisters Share the Inspiring Story of St Carlo Acutis

Our Year 4 and Year 6 students were recently blessed to welcome the Missionary Sisters, who visited our classrooms to share the remarkable life and witness of St Carlo Acutis, the first millennial saint. Through stories, discussion and prayer, students learned how Carlo used his gifts, particularly his love of technology, to spread the Gospel and encourage devotion to the Eucharist.

Students discovered Carlo's simple yet powerful path to holiness through frequent reception of the Sacraments, prayer, devotion to the Rosary and daily participation in Mass. They were inspired by his famous words, "The Eucharist is my highway to Heaven," and challenged to consider how they too can grow closer to Jesus in their everyday lives.

A particularly special moment was the opportunity to venerate a first-class relic of St Carlo Acutis—a strand of his hair. Students were also given prayer cards, which were touched to the relic during the visit, making them third-class relics. The sisters explained the significance of relics in the Catholic tradition and how they help us remember and seek the prayers of the saints, our heavenly friends.

We thank the Missionary Sisters for sharing this wonderful experience with our students and helping them to see that sainthood is not something reserved for a few extraordinary people, but a call from God for each one of us.

Health and Wellbeing

Health Notices

Seasonal illness

We ask families to please monitor for the following symptoms: Fever, vomiting or diarrhoea, persistent cough, sore throat or runny nose, fatigue or general unwellness.

If your child is unwell:

- Please keep them at home until they are well enough to participate in school activities.
- Students should be symptom-free for at least 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school, and at least 48 hours following vomiting or diarrhoea.
- Encourage good hygiene practices at home, including regular handwashing and covering coughs and sneezes.
- Please notify the school if your child has been diagnosed with a contagious illness.

Head lice

We have recently had several reported cases of head lice within the school community. We ask all families to regularly check their children's hair for any signs of head lice or eggs (nits), particularly behind the ears and at the nape of the neck.

Early detection and treatment are important in helping to prevent the spread of head lice. If head lice are found, please commence appropriate treatment and notify the school office so that we can continue to monitor and support our school community.

We ask families to be mindful of the allergies within their child's class .

Child Safety Updates

PROTECT – Keeping Children Safe

At St Peter's, the safety and wellbeing of every child is our highest priority. We are committed to creating a child-safe environment where all children feel safe, respected and supported.

Families play an important role in helping children stay safe. Talking openly with children about personal safety, trusted adults and speaking up when something does not feel right can help children build confidence and seek support when needed.



Helpful ways to support your child include:

- 1. Encouraging open conversations and listening without judgement*
- 2. Teaching children about body safety, consent and personal boundaries*
- 3. Helping children identify trusted adults they can talk to if they feel unsafe or worried*
- 4. Monitoring online activity and discussing safe and respectful use of technology and social media*
- 5. Reminding children that it is always okay to ask for help and that their safety matters*

Seasons for Growth

Seasons for Growth Children & Young People's Program Learning to live with change and loss Everyone is affected by change and loss at some time in our lives. At St Peters Primary School we recognise that when changes occur such as separation, divorce, death, school transitions and natural disasters children may benefit from learning the skills to manage these changes effectively. We are therefore, offering an education program called Seasons for Growth which will commence on Monday 24 August.

This program is facilitated in small groups of up to 7 participants and is based on research which highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on building skills such as how to manage feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and develops peer support networks. Participation in the program can promote improved self-esteem and self-confidence as well as giving children the opportunity to find their own voice amid change.

If you think your child/young person would benefit from joining the Seasons for Growth program, we encourage you to talk to them about it. We are pleased to be able to offer this successful program and we are confident that it will be a valuable learning experience for those involved.

Student Absence

Regular school attendance is essential for every child's learning, wellbeing and sense of belonging within our school community. Recent statistics across Victoria have highlighted an increasing number of students missing valuable learning time through late arrivals, early collections, sick days and extended absences due to family holidays.

Every school day matters. Even small amounts of missed time can have a significant impact on a child's academic progress, social development and classroom confidence. Establishing consistent attendance habits helps students build positive routines, maintain friendships and fully engage in all learning opportunities. **We ask families to continue supporting their child by ensuring they arrive at school on time each day and remain at school for the full school day wherever possible.**

While we understand that illness and exceptional circumstances do arise, we encourage parents to carefully consider the impact of avoidable absences during term time.

Please also note that all student absences, including late arrivals and early departures, are formally recorded and will appear on Semester 1 reports distributed at the end of this term.

If you are experiencing any challenges with supporting your child to attend school, please contact the school. We welcome the opportunity to work together to support your child's attendance and wellbeing.

Child Safe Standard 5

“Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.”

As Catholic educators, we have a moral, mission-driven and legal responsibility to uphold and actively promote the human flourishing, wellbeing and safety of every student entrusted in our care. Our commitment to the protection of children and young people is grounded in the Gospel message and related principles of justice, inclusion, and respect. This ensures the diverse needs of every child are recognized and treated with both dignity and care. Our Catholic communities strive to create faith filled, welcoming and inclusive environments where the dignity of every child and young person is promoted, equity is embedded, and the unique needs of every child are respected.

This newsletter series provides an overview of what the Child Safe Standards are, how they are designed to help keep children and young people safe and what schools governed by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) are doing to prioritise and achieve this.

Overview of Child Safe Standard 5:

To be aligned, schools must support the following:

- Families participate in decisions affecting their child
- The organisation engages and openly communicates with families and the community about its child safe approach and relevant information is accessible.
- Families and communities have a say in the development and review of the organisation’s policies
- Families, carers and the community are informed about the organisation’s operations and governance.



The Child Safe Standards

The Child Safe Standards are a set of guidelines that help organisations create safe environments for children and young people.

They make sure that children are protected from harm, listened to, and respected. These standards require organisations to have strong leadership, clear policies, and a culture that puts children first.

As a parent or carer, you can expect organisations to involve families, empower children, train staff properly, and respond to concerns quickly and respectfully.



“There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.”

How do our schools ensure every child is treated fairly and their unique needs are respected?

- In our schools, we believe that every child has the right to be treated fairly, included, and supported according to their diverse needs and background. These three principles are part of **Child Safe Standard 5**, which focuses on equity and diversity.
- **Equity** is about ensuring justice, recognising that children may need different levels of support to participate fully in learning, activities, and school life.
- **Inclusion** means creating environments where all children, regardless of culture, ability, language, or background, can flourish and are treated justly and are valued, respected, and welcomed.
- **Respect for diversity** is about honouring and celebrating the unique identity of every child, ensuring that differences are recognised as strengths and that everyone's rights and dignity are upheld.

How Parents, Carers and Guardians can get involved!

Child Safe Standard 5 is about making sure schools, families, carers and the wider community work together to keep children safe. Here are some simple ways families can help:

- **Talk about inclusion and fairness:** Discuss diversity, equity, and respect with your child, and encourage them to appreciate differences in others.
- **Share insights about your child:** Let staff know if your child has specific needs or cultural practices that should be considered in school activities.
- **Participate in school programs and events:** Support initiatives that celebrate diversity and inclusion, such as cultural festivals, learning programs, or wellbeing initiatives.
- **Provide feedback:** Take part in surveys or discussions about school policies and practices, ensuring the school considers diverse perspectives.
- **Model respect and inclusion:** Demonstrate equitable, respectful, and inclusive behaviour at home and in community activities, children learn these values through example.

Supporting Children's Mental Health: Five Signs to Look Out For

Children naturally experience ups and downs, but ongoing changes in mood, behaviour or habits can sometimes indicate that they need extra support. Recognising these signs early and providing a calm, supportive environment can make a significant difference to a child's wellbeing.

Some common signs to be aware of include:

- Ongoing changes in mood, such as persistent sadness, irritability or withdrawal.
- Pulling away from friends, hobbies and activities they once enjoyed.
- Physical symptoms such as headaches, stomach aches or changes to sleep patterns.
- Avoiding situations that make them feel anxious or overwhelmed.
- Difficulty managing emotions or recovering from setbacks.

While these signs do not necessarily indicate a serious problem, they can signal that a child may be struggling and would benefit from additional support.

How Families Can Help

There are many simple ways parents and carers can support their child's emotional wellbeing:

- **Maintain routines:** Consistent mealtimes, bedtimes and daily routines help children feel safe and secure.
- **Prioritise healthy habits:** Good sleep, regular physical activity and balanced nutrition are all important for emotional wellbeing.
- **Listen without rushing to fix:** Providing a calm, non-judgemental space helps children feel heard and understood.
- **Work together with the school:** Sharing concerns with your child's teacher can ensure a consistent and supportive approach across home and school.
- **Model healthy coping strategies:** Children learn by watching the adults around them. Demonstrating positive ways to manage stress helps build resilience.

Primary school years bring many changes and challenges. With patience, understanding and strong connections between home and school, children can develop the confidence and resilience they need to thrive.
