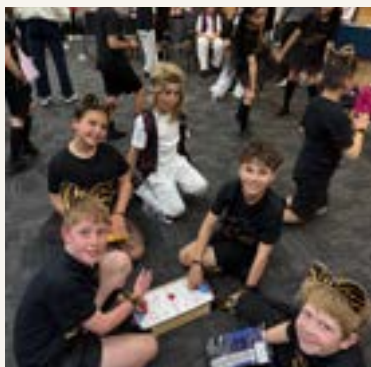


Step Right Up!

A message from MACS our governing body

Supporting Our Staff While Planning for the Future

Currently, all Catholic schools are working through planning and budgeting activities for 2027 to ensure we are well placed to support our staff, students and school communities in the coming year. This includes looking at how we can accommodate the changes that will flow from a new Enterprise Bargaining Agreement (EBA) recently met with school staff.

We recognise the significant financial pressures many households are facing, and we are making a conscious effort to ensure these costs are not passed on through significant fee increases.

We will continue to keep our parent community informed throughout this process. As always, our focus remains on maintaining strong school communities and continuing to deliver a high-quality Catholic education for every student.

A Message from St Peter's

At St Peter's, we are still planning and budgeting for 2027 and are working closely with MACS throughout this process.

I appreciate that families will have questions about what this means for 2027.

I can confirm that St Peter's will move to a **tiered fee structure in 2027, in line with the MACS requirement for all schools**. I had chosen not to introduce the tiered structure in 2026; however, it will now be required for 2027.

A tiered structure does not mean that fees simply double or triple for families with more than one child. We are currently working through the details of the structure for our school.

I will share the 2027 Fee Schedule with our families as soon as it is finalised to assist with planning for the year ahead.

Child Safety Update

A Change to Our Public Social Media

As part of our ongoing commitment to student safety and privacy, St Peter's is making some changes to the way we use our public social media.

The Australian eSafety Commissioner has recently provided updated guidance for schools about sharing student images online, particularly as technology makes it easier for publicly available photos to be copied, altered or used outside their original context.

eSafety encourages schools to take a more considered, risk-based approach to what is shared publicly and what may be better suited to closed or restricted communication channels.

With this in mind, our Instagram will continue to celebrate the learning, achievements, faith, events and community life of St Peter's, while taking a more considered approach to how individual students are shown publicly.

Our students will still be very much part of our social media. You will continue to see learning in action, school events, student work, celebrations and everyday moments, simply photographed and shared a little differently.

More personal and identifiable student photos will continue to be shared with families through our password-protected newsletter and other closed school communication channels.

We know that seeing our students' smiling faces brings warmth to our school communications, but we believe this is a positive and responsible step in balancing how we share the life of St Peter's with our responsibility to protect the children in our care.

As part of this change, we are also moving to a new school-managed Instagram account. Our current account will become inactive in three weeks.

Health and Wellbeing

Health Notices

Seasonal illness

We ask families to please monitor for the following symptoms: Fever, vomiting or diarrhoea, persistent cough, sore throat or runny nose, fatigue or general unwellness.

If your child is unwell:

- Please keep them at home until they are well enough to participate in school activities.
- Students should be symptom-free for at least 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school, and at least 48 hours following vomiting or diarrhoea.
- Encourage good hygiene practices at home, including regular handwashing and covering coughs and sneezes.
- Please notify the school if your child has been diagnosed with a contagious illness.

Head lice

We ask all families to regularly check their children's hair for any signs of head lice or eggs (nits).

Early detection and treatment are important in helping to prevent the spread of head lice.

If head lice are found, please commence appropriate treatment and notify the school office so that we can continue to monitor and support our school community.

Allergies

We ask families to be mindful of the allergies within their child's year level.

Year P: Dairy, egg, prawns, lychee, pistachios, cashews

Year 1: Peanut, walnut, pecan, sesame

Year 3: Egg, tree nuts, peanuts, walnuts, hazelnuts, pecans, seafood

Year 4: Pistachio, cashew, walnut, pecan, egg, milk/dairy, wheat, macadamia, kiwi, peanuts, shellfish

Year 5: Soy sauce

Year 6: Walnuts, hazelnuts, macadamias, cashews, pistachios, tree nuts, pecans, eggs, shellfish

Student Absence

Regular school attendance is essential for every child's learning, wellbeing and sense of belonging within our school community.

Recent statistics across Victoria have highlighted an increasing number of students missing valuable learning time through late arrivals, early collections, sick days and extended absences due to family holidays.

Every school day matters. Even small amounts of missed time can have a significant impact on a child's academic progress, social development and classroom confidence. Establishing consistent attendance habits helps students build positive routines, maintain friendships and fully engage in all learning opportunities.

We ask families to continue supporting their child by ensuring they arrive at school on time each day and remain at school for the full school day wherever possible.

While we understand that illness and exceptional circumstances do arise, we encourage parents to carefully consider the impact of avoidable absences during term time.

If you are experiencing any challenges with supporting your child to attend school, please contact the school. We welcome the opportunity to work together to support your child's attendance and wellbeing.

Thank you for your ongoing partnership and support in prioritising your child's education and attendance at school.

Child Safe Standard 8

"Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training."

As Catholic educators, we have a moral, mission-driven, and legal responsibility to ensure the safety and wellbeing of every student entrusted to our care.

Our commitment to child safety includes equipping all staff and volunteers with the knowledge, skills, and awareness they need to recognise, prevent, and respond to risks of harm. Through ongoing education and training, our school communities foster a culture where safety is central, children's voices are valued, and staff feel confident and capable in promoting wellbeing.

Catholic schools maintain clear policies, procedures, and professional learning programs to support staff and volunteers in their child-safe roles. By embedding child safety knowledge and skills across every aspect of school life, we ensure that children are protected, supported, and nurtured in a safe environment.

This newsletter series provides an overview of what the Child Safe Standards are, how they help keep children and young people safe, and how schools governed by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) are prioritising and achieving this.

Overview of the Child Safe Standards:

The Victorian Child Safe Standards are a set of 11 minimum requirements that all organisations working with children must adhere to.

These standards are designed to:

- Promote the participation and empowerment of children, young people and their families
- Prevent harm and abuse of children and young people
- Ensure child safety is a shared responsibility
- Support the wellbeing of all children, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and children with disabilities

These standards apply to all school staff, volunteers, contractors, and anyone working with children in schools.

***Child Safe Standard 8** reminds us that children are safest when the adults around them have the right knowledge, skills, and awareness to protect them. As scripture says, "Those with knowledge grow in strength" (Proverbs 24:5). This means that keeping children safe isn't just about having rules or policies, it's about making sure all staff and volunteers receive ongoing training and support. When adults are well-informed and prepared, they can spot risks early, respond appropriately to concerns, and create learning environments where children feel safe, supported, and valued.*

Why is it important that staff and volunteers are trained in child safety?

Children are safest when the adults around them know how to recognise risks, respond to concerns, and act in ways that protect their wellbeing. Ongoing training and professional learning help staff and volunteers understand their responsibilities, stay up to date with best practices, and feel confident in keeping children safe. When schools have well-trained staff, they can respond quickly to any concerns, prevent harm before it happens, and build trust with children and families.

Spotlight on Child Safe Standard 8

"Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training."

Child Safe Standard 8 reminds us that keeping children safe depends on adults having the right knowledge, skills, and awareness. Training and ongoing learning help staff and volunteers understand how to recognise risks, respond to concerns, and create safe, supportive environments. When adults are well-prepared, children feel protected, listened to, and valued, and the whole school community grows stronger in keeping safety at the centre of everything we do.

What does this look like?

- **Clear and accessible processes:** We provide simple, child-friendly and family-friendly ways to raise concerns or make complaints, including clear information about who to contact and what to expect.
- **Listening and taking concerns seriously:** All concerns raised by children, parents, carers, staff, or community members are treated with respect and care.
- **Timely and thoughtful responses:** Concerns are responded to promptly and thoroughly, with appropriate action taken to support safety and wellbeing.
- **Appropriate reporting and cooperation:** Where required, concerns are reported to relevant authorities, and the school cooperates fully to ensure children are protected.



How Parents, Carers and Guardians can get involved:

Child Safe Standard 8 works best when schools, families, and staff work together to ensure children's safety.

Families can help by:

- **Supporting learning at home:** Encourage children to talk about their day, their feelings, and any concerns they may have.
- **Understanding school training initiatives:** Ask about the professional learning programs staff undertake and how they support child safety.
- **Reinforcing safety skills:** Discuss safety and wellbeing practices with your child, helping them recognise trusted adults and safe behaviours.
- **Collaborating with the school:** Engage respectfully with staff, recognising that ongoing training strengthens the school's ability to protect children.

Coming onsite

Spare Clothes Reminder

Accidents can happen, so we kindly ask families to ensure their child has a spare pair of underwear in their school bag.

If your child has previously borrowed emergency clothing from the sick bay, please return the items washed to the school office. This will help us maintain an adequate supply of clothing for students when needed.

- Guitar or ukulele: \$10 per week

Hire terms apply. Students must purchase or hire an instrument before beginning lessons.

- Acoustic guitar kit: \$130–\$160, depending on size
- Method and theory books: as required

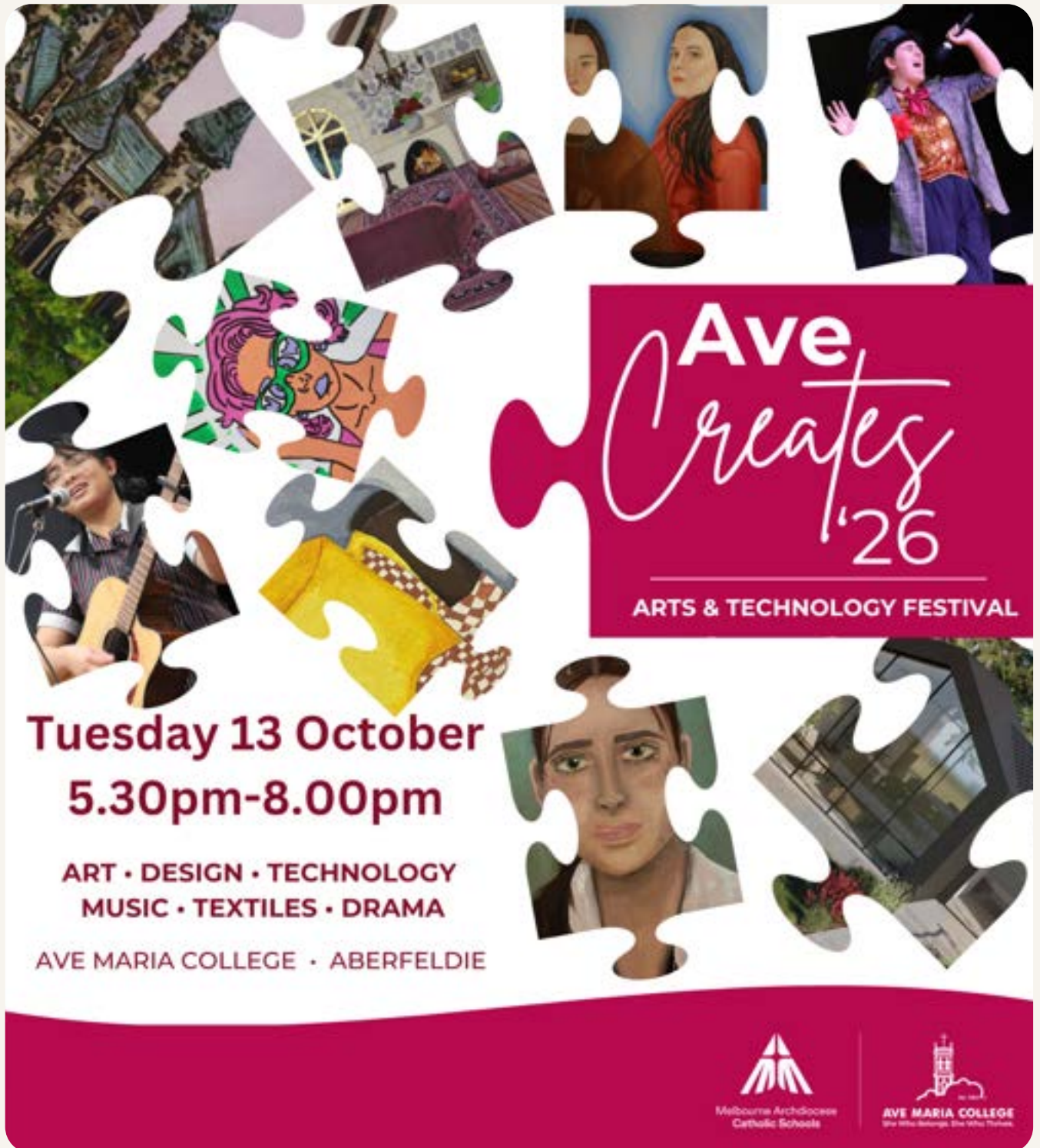
